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And What More Shall I Say?

Week Five

Memory Verse: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

Hebrews 11:1

Challenge Verse: "looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Hebrews 12:2

Hebrews 11:32-40 teaches us that Jesus fulfills all God's promises.

Day 1 - Read Hebrews 11 As a family, make a list of all of the people listed in Hebrews 11 and how they showed that they were living by faith. After making the list, look back at verses 13 & 39-40. What was the promise they did not receive? Talk about who/ what the promise was and how it is received (Ephesians 2:8-9 should give you a hint.)

Day 2 - Read Daniel 6 For the next 3 days, we're going to look at some of the people mentioned at the end of Hebrews 11 and how they lived by faith. For each day, read the passage, draw a picture of the story and then write/talk about how they showed that faith in God was the most important thing in their lives.

Day 3 - Read Daniel 3

Day 4 - Read 1 Samuel 17

Day 5 - Read Romans 3:3-5 For 4 weeks, we've looked at examples of people who lived by faith as they hoped for a future deliverance through Jesus. But we know that none of these people were perfect. Romans 3:10-12 reminds us that we are all sinners. As we finish this study on faith, let's remember one thing - GOD IS FAITHFUL! These men may have shown faith, but always imperfectly. But God is perfectly faithful, and He fulfilled His promise to Adam & Noah & Abraham & Moses & David and all these other men by sending Jesus to die on the cross in our place.
